MMSI Provider Services

South Country Health Alliance (SCHA) encourages providers to call Provider Services as their first point of contact regarding eligibility inquiries, benefit determination questions, and claim status issues. When you call you will speak with a knowledgeable Provider Services Specialist. They are there to help with many questions such as (but not limited to):

- Member eligibility
- Member benefit and product information
- Claims status or adjustment
- Facilities, hospitals, dialysis centers, hospice providers, surgery centers, skilled nursing facilities (SNF)
- Claim reimbursement determinations or adjustments
- Claim processing
- Billing questions
- Claim rejections
- Coordination of benefits
- Authorizations
- Co-payments and coinsurances as related to member benefits
- Clarification regarding claim processing procedures and provider communications

MMSI Customer Service Representatives are available to answer general questions, check claim status, and identify participating providers. If the MMSI CSR is unable to answer the provider (or SCHA staff member) question, they will route to the appropriate internal claims staff member.

If MMSI claims staff is unable to resolve, the issue will be routed to Network Development, who will identify who the contract holder.

The contract manager is the point person for contract related issues.
